How will BAPCO refining transform Bahrain's energy sector?

In the next 60 days, the Kingdom of Bahrain's energy sector will achieve a pivotal milestone as Bapco Refining, a subsidiary of Bapco Energies, embarks on an important phase of its refinery modernization startup journey. This is a historical step toward reinforcing Bahrain's position as a leader in energy innovation.

Why is Bahrain reorganizing its oil & gas company?

Bahrain's utilities segment is driving demand for new infrastructure and investment due in part to renewable energy and efficiency strategies. The government is restructuring its oil and gas holding company, Bapco Energies.

What is BAPCO energy?

The Bapco Energies[a](????? ??????), formerly NOGA holding, is a semi-independent agency within the Ministry of Oil and Gas in the nation of Bahrain whose mission is to develop the nation's petroleum resources.

How many subsidiaries does BAPCO energies have?

As of 2022, Bapco Energies owned two corporate subsidiaries and had assets of more than US\$10.2 billion. In December 2015, Bapco Energies signed an agreement with Teekay Corp., a Canadian -based petroleum shipping firm, to build a liquefied natural gas (LNG) import terminal in Bahrain.

How is Bahrain navigating the energy transition?

Bahrain, known as the birthplace of the Arabian Peninsula's oil industry, is navigating the challenges and opportunities of the energy transition. While focusing on renewables production, energy efficiency and sustainability, the kingdom is also leveraging its remaining hydrocarbons resources.

Will Bahrain commercialise hydrocarbons by 2023?

Though there had been limited progress as of May 2022, the kingdom is hoping to commercialise the discovery by 2023. Under the Bahrain Economic Vision 2030 plan, the kingdom is striving to transition its economy away from a dependence on hydrocarbons.

Abu Dhabi Future Energy Company, better known as Masdar, and Bahrain's Bapco Energies have joined forces to develop and invest in near-shore and offshore wind projects of up to 2 GW in the Arab Kingdom.

Bapco Energies was established in August 2007 as a subsidiary unit of the National Oil and Gas Authority (NOGA), the Government of Bahrain's petroleum industry regulator. Bapco Energies was intended to concentrate and refocus NOGA's oil, gas, and petrochemical development activities. NOGA was abolished in September 2021. Bapco Energies became a semi-independent agency within Bahrain's Ministry of Oil and Gas.

Given Bahrain's climate, solar energy is a vital part of the kingdom's clean energy mix, accounting for 93% of its renewable capacity in 2020.
