Gastric bypass with or without gastric resection is another effective treatment for gastroparesis. Diabetes is frequently associated with both obesity and gastroparesis. Studies have shown both significant symptom reduction as well as decreased use of prokinetics after Roux-en-Y gastric bypass (RYGB).

Can gastrectomy cure gastroparesis in obese patients?

This can be done laparoscopically or endoscopically (called G-POEM). Vertical sleeve gastrectomy, a procedure in which a part or all of the affected portion of the stomach is removed, has shown some success in the treatment of gastroparesis in obese patients, even curing it in some instances.

Can Subtotal gastrectomy improve symptoms of gastroparesis?

In a study by Forstner-Barthell et al., subtotal or completion gastrectomy was shown to improve symptoms in 67% of patients (n = 62) with gastroparesis, including postprandial pain, nausea, and vomiting. However, due to the structural and physiologic changes in response to SG, it may be a viable alternative for treating gastroparesis.
