With regard to solar power, Kosovo's installed capacity at the end of 2020 stood at 20,9MW, the bulk of which are sited at agricultural facilities throughout the country. However, a few recently announced solar power projects are poised to increase that number significantly.⁹

Kosovo* could install 250 MW of solar capacities for self consumption, both in the prosumer and the behind-the-meter category, which will bring investments of around EUR 300 million, said Lorik Haxhiu, local project coordinator for the USAID-funded Kosovo Energy Security of Supply activity.
