The government of Malta launched six new grant schemes to incentivise the production, storage and use of renewable energy as part of the EUR9 million investment. The aid for solar energy will accommodate households with already existing systems to utilise battery powered systems and help new families setup the installation of new solar panel systems.

Does Malta offer a government rebate scheme for solar panels?

What percentage of PV installations are in Malta?

The government said it will provide further information on the bidding process in March. According to 2022 figures from Malta's National Statistics Office, residential PV installations accounted for 93.5% of Malta's total PV capacity, followed by the commercial and public sectors, which accounted for 5.7% and 0.8%, respectively.

Malta has extended its feed-in tariffs (FITs) and a rebate scheme to support the adoption of residential solar and battery energy storage systems for another year. The authorities will start accepting applicants for the two initiatives again from Feb. 23.

The government of Malta launched new grant schemes for 2024 to incentivise the use of renewable energy as part of the EUR4.8 million investment in renewable energy systems for households. Applications are open from Friday the 23 rd of February 2024

The schemes presented will include battery ready PV systems with a Feed-In Tariff of 10c5/kWh for 20 years and a PV grant of EUR3,000 (capped at 50% of Capex). Other packages include the PV system with battery storage.

The third scheme supports new combined PV and battery storage systems which self-consume more solar-generated electricity.

This scheme is funded through national funds and applies to private individuals (natural persons) for use on their residential properties, and for organisations that are not carrying out an economic activity, provided that photovoltaic installation should have no active feed-in tariff allocation.
