Will Morocco become a green energy hub?

The country's solar and wind expansion has been long in the making, dating back to a 2009 energy plan. The goal was to reach 42% of installed renewable power capacity by 2020. "King [Mohammed VI] wanted to turn Morocco into a green energy hub because of climate change," said Mokhtari.

Does Morocco need green energy?

The EU has an insatiable demand for Morocco's green energy. In addition to their ambitious net-zero targets by 2050, many EU economies are eying green energy imports from North Africa to strengthen their energy security. How ambitious is Morocco's energy strategy?

The 2009 energy strategy proved to be slightly too ambitious: Morocco missed its 2020 target for renewable power capacity by 5%. But the government seems to be on track to meet a 2030 target of 52%, according to a recent report by the consulting firm Ernst & Young (EY).

Despite this, over 50% of the wind energy projects in Morocco are being developed by the private sector. Morocco has set a goal of investing \$1 billion per year in solar and wind power, and increased domestic renewables would cut its energy import bill by \$15 billion per year.
