



# Solar panels scheme Austria

Austrian agency OeMAG is allocating EUR135 million (\$146.4 million) of incentives under Austria's Renewable Energy Expansion Act (EAG).

The Austrian government has decided to introduce a "Made in Europe" bonus for PV projects above 35 kW in size with solar modules that are manufactured in Europe.

Homeowners installing solar panels will be able to save an average of EUR1,500 when installing solar panels alongside a new boiler system. As of November 2023, the Austrian government has already approved 2 gigawatts of solar power, amounting to roughly 121,000 successful applications to its solar bonus scheme.

The Austrian government has brought in force its market premium subsidy scheme under the country's Renewable Expansion Act (EAG) to be awarded to winning projects after a competitive auction process, 1 st of which is due to be launched on December 13, 2022, said local association Photovoltaic Austria (PV Austria).
