At least 50% of the roofs of new high-rise buildings in Uzbekistan will be occupied by solar panels . From May 1, Uzbekistan introduces a requirement to install solar panels on at least 50% of the free part of the roof of multi-story buildings put into operation

Uzbekistan has great potential for solar energy due to its high levels of solar radiation and large areas of barren land that can be used for solar power plants. The country receives an average of around 300 sunny days per year, making it an ideal location for solar power generation.

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To date, solar panels with a combined capacity of 600 megawatts have been installed in Uzbekistan across various buildings and homes, with further installations ongoing, the presidential press service reported.

The Project builds on the World Bank energy program in Uzbekistan by scaling up the private investment and commercial financing, diversification of power mix from domestic resources (solar), clean energy transition and decarbonization. Solar Panels in Uzbekistan: Uzbekistan is blessed with abundant sunlight, especially in its western regions like Xorazm, Bukhara, and Navoi. This geographical advantage sets the stage for the country's growing solar power industry.

Since 2021, Uzbekistan has commissioned ten green power plants, including nine solar and one wind, with a combined capacity exceeding 2,500 megawatts, as part of its broader effort to shift towards renewable energy and reduce fossil fuel dependency.

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
